# Department 106 - Horse & Pony and Horseless Horse

Gymkhana – Sunday, June 30, 2024 (9 AM) Pleasure Show - Saturday, July 20, 2024 (9 AM)

#### **Exhibitors**:

- Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Horse & Pony or Horseless Horse project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.
- Horseless Horse project members may enter in Class G and/or H. They may only show 1 animal.

#### **Entry Information:**

- Exhibitors MUST include Farm Premise ID on entry.
- Wisconsin approved identification must be entered on online entry for all animals entered.
- A maximum of <u>2</u> animals may be entered by a single exhibitor.
- For each project animal, exhibitors will receive a total of 2 premiums. A premium for 1 class in which the animal is judged and a premium for 1 class in which the exhibitor is judged.
  - A showmanship (Class A) OR horsemanship/equitation (Class B) for one premium - Exhibitor is judged - AND
  - A pleasure (Class C) OR halter (Class D) OR performance (Class E) or (Class F) - Project animal is judged - for another premium.
- Beginner classes are open <u>only</u> to exhibitors who are first or second-year members in the Horse and Pony project.
- All Horse and Pony & Horseless Horse exhibitors are eligible to enter educational exhibits. See Dept. 110 Class H.

#### Horse:

- Horse must have proof of current negative Coggins Test.
   Please bring the original and 1 copy the copy will be kept in the fair's files. Any horse or pony not meeting these requirements will be required to leave the show grounds.
- It is highly recommended that horses have up-to-date eastern and western encephalitis vaccine, tetanus, and influenza or the 4-in-1 shot and rabies.
- No stallions born prior to January 1 of current year may be shown.
- Lame horses will be excused.

### **Show Information**:

- A parent or guardian must accompany exhibitors while on show grounds the day of the show.
- Boots and a long sleeve shirt are required for ALL classes including gymkhana. A short-sleeve shirt is permissible only when a jacket is worn. If jackets become optional, a longsleeve shirt is required.
- SEI approved helmets with harness securely fastened are required any time an exhibitor is mounted or driving a horse or pony on the fairgrounds.
- Any exhibitor who causes a potential safety hazard will be excused from the show ring by the fair superintendent.
- Exhibitor numbers must be worn by exhibitors at all times during the show.
- Professional grooms or trainers are not allowed to work with horses or exhibitors on the fairgrounds.
- Exhibitor is the only person allowed to ride or drive a horse/pony on the fairgrounds.
- There is a two-minute gate limit. A two-minute tack change is permitted when requested.

# **CLASS A — Showmanship** — Judged on the exhibitor's ability to show the horse or pony in hand. Danish Judging. Lot Numbers

- 1. Western pony
- 2. English pony
- 3. Western horse
- 4. English horse
- 5. Draft horse
- 5. BEGINNERS horse or pony English or Western
  - Beginner members MAY NOT enter lots 1-5
  - Beginner classes open ONLY to exhibitors that are first or second-year members in the Horse & Pony project

# CLASS B - Horsemanship/Equitation – Judged on the exhibitor's ability to ride a horse or pony under saddle. Danish Judging. If pony class is offered, pony must be shown in designated pony class. Lot Numbers

- 7. Western stock seat pony
- 8. Western stock seat horse
- 9. English saddle seat pony
- 10. English saddle seat horse
- 11. English hunt seat pony
- 12. English hunt seat horse
- Walk/Trot Equitation, horse or pony, English or western (exhibitor and horse combination may not enter any other lot number requiring a canter or lope)
- 14. BEGINNER Walk/Trot/Canter (may not enter lots 7-13)
- 15. Reinsmanship driving pony
- 16. Reinsmanship driving horse
- 17. Reinsmanship driving draft horse

# CLASS C — Pleasure - Horse or pony is judged as to its performance as a pleasure mount or as a pleasure to drive. If pony class is offered, pony must be shown in designated pony class. Judged Danish. Lot numbers

- 18. Western pony
- 19. Western Horse
- 20. English saddle seat pony
- 21. English saddle seat horse
- 22. English hunt seat pony
- 23. English hunt seat horse
- Green broke pleasure (horse never to have been shown in a canter class prior to this year and not permitted in any other riding class except Trail)
- Walk/trot pleasure horse or pony, English or Western (exhibitor and horse combination may not enter any other lot number for lope or canter)
- BEGINNER Walk/Trot/Canter, English or Western (may not enter lots 18-25)
- 27. Pleasure driving pony
- 28. Pleasure driving horse
- 29. Pleasure driving draft horse

#### Classification:

- 2 years old and under: born on or after January 1 two years preceding exhibit year – NO stallions
- Over 2 years old: born prior to January 1 two years preceding exhibit year NO stallions
- Pony: 14 hands (56 inches) or less is considered a pony. Horses/ponies must be measured before May 30 – NO stallions
- Mules may be shown in horse or pony classes based on height NO stallions



**CLASS D — Halter** — Conformation of a horse or pony is judged.

Regular judging – 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> only

- 30. Mare and foal pony (emphasis on foal)
- 31. Mare and foal horse (emphasis on foal)
- 32. Pony (<14 hands) 2 years and under
- 33. Pony (<14 hands) over 2 years
- 34. Western horse, 2 years and under
- 35. Western horse, over 2 years
- 36. English horse, 2 years and under
- 37. English horse, over 2 years
- 38. Beginner horse or pony, English or Western (Beginner classes are open only to exhibitors that are first or second-year members in the Horse project may NOT enter in Lot 62-69.

### **CLASS E – Horse and Pony Performance**

Exhibitor may enter only 1 horse/pony in each lot number Regular judging – 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> only

- Lots 71-74 are judged on ability of horse/pony and rider to work in unison
- Exhibitor/horse combination may choose 1 entry from Lots 71, 72, 73, or 74.
- For Dressage entries each horse/rider combination may enter 2 consecutive levels (example: intro & training, training & level 1) and ride a maximum of 2 tests (See handbook for dressage patterns)
- 39. Intro Test A (2019), Test B (2021), Test C (2022) Walk/Trot
- 40. Training Level Test 1 (2019), Test 2 (2021), Test 3 (2022)
- 41. Western Dressage-Intro Test 1 (2019), Test 2 (2021), Test 3 (2022)
- 42. Western Dressage Basic Level 1 (2019), Level 2 (2021), Level 3 (2022)
- 43. Horse/Pony Presentation Judged on cleanliness of exhibitor and horse. Youth should be able to answer a general knowledge question about the care of their horse and be able to identify parts of their horse. (face-to-face judging ribbon only)
  - Lots 42 OR 43 Trail Judged on skill of horse and rider to negotiate obstacles that could be encountered on a trail.
- 44. Trail 1 Pattern (walk/trot) horse or pony/rider combo has 1-2 years' experience in trail class (English or Western)
- 45. Trail 2 Pattern horse or pony/rider combo has 3 or more years' experience in trail class (English or Western)
- 46. In Hand Trail Pattern (in hand) Horse or pony, any age (Horse/rider combo will not be allowed in any trail class under saddle)
- Trail Therapeutic Each rider/horse team shall have a halter under the bridle, with a mandatory leader working a short lead (6-8 feet) – walk/trot only
  - Lots 46 or 47 Western Riding Judged on the ability of the rider to show the horse's skill.
- 48. Western Riding 1 horse or pony/rider has 1-2 years' experience in Western riding class.
- Western Riding 2 horse or pony/rider has 3 or more years' experience in Western riding class.
  - Lots 48 and 49 Cone Obstacle Judged on skill of pony or horse and driver to negotiate obstacle course.
- 50. Cone Obstacle Driving Horse
- 51. Cone Obstacle Driving Pony
  - Lots 50 <u>OR</u> 51 Ranch Riding Judged on versatility and willingness of horse to complete posted ranch pattern - not a pleasure class.
- 52. Ranch Riding Walk/trot (ribbon only)

- 53. Ranch Riding Walk/trot/canter (ribbon only)
- 54. Ranch Rail Walk/trot (ribbon only)
- 55. Ranch Rail Walk/trot/canter (ribbon only)
- 56. Hunter Hack Cross rails (ribbon only)
- 57. Equitation over fences 2-2.6 feet (ribbon only)

# <u>CLASS F – Gymkhana Performance</u> - Sunday, June 30

– Regular Judging – 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> only (ribbons only)

Rider should be able to canter for these timed events, but trotting is allowed. Other fun classes will be added at the show.

# **CLASS G – Horseless Horse**

- Judged on the ability of the rider to show/ride a horse or pony.
- Member to have worked with a horse project member/leader and horse/pony for a minimum of 10 hours for the project year.
- Exhibitors are only allowed to walk/trot.
- No more than 1 exhibit per member in this class for a premium.
- Premiums: \$1.75 \$1.50 \$1.25 \$1.00

### **CLASS H – Model Horse**

- Maximum of 4 entries per exhibitor in this class.
- Size of exhibit is limited to 14" x 22"
- Premiums: \$1.75 \$1.50 \$1.25 \$1.00

- 801. Showmanship with doll
- 802. Driving
- 803. Trail
- 804. Fantasy costume
- 805. Any other costume
- 806. Pleasure, English, or Western
- 807. Gymkhana/speed
- 808. Any other model horse not listed above
