## Entry Information

- Open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Crops project or youth of other groups doing equivalent work.
- Maximum of 18 entries in Class A - Field Crops.
- 1 entry per lot number.


## Exhibit Information

- See poster rules, if applicable.
- Display size is limited to $22^{\prime \prime} \times 28^{\prime \prime}$.
- All exhibits must be prepared for display prior to arriving at the fair.
- All entry tag must be attached (not taped) to the outside of the bag.
- Field crop variety MUST be written on back of entry tag or exhibit will be dropped one placing.
- Unless otherwise indicated, exhibit should consist of 3 quarts in a 1-gallon zip lock bag
- Premiums: \$2.50-\$2.25-\$2.00-\$1.75

- All exhibits should be prepared prior to coming to check-in on entry day.
