Open Class Judging on Thursday

#### Entry Info:

- A market hog will consist of a barrow or gilt. A barrow is a male castrated and healed.
- Entries may include purebred, grade, or crossbreed hogs
- No more than 2 entries per exhibitor.
- A registration or Wisconsin approved ear tag number <u>must</u> be included with the entry. Entries will not be accepted without it.
- Youth who have completed 3<sup>rd</sup> grade may exhibit animals in Open Class.
- Animal fee \$5/entry.

### Exhibit Info:

- It is recommended that exhibitors have liability insurance.
- Exhibits must abide by the Wisconsin county fair animal health rules.
- It is recommended that exhibitors have liability insurance.
- The farm Premise ID number MUST be included on the Animal Check-In Forms due to the Superintendent on entry day. This form can be found on the fair's website: <u>www.OutagamieCountyFair.com</u>.
- Hogs should be clean. Use of oil or powder is prohibited.
- Back tag numbers must be worn by exhibitor.


#### **CLASS B – Breeding Stock**

- Purebred (registered) animals must provide paperwork.
- Pen of feeder pigs can be mixed genders.
- Pen of feeder pigs (between 40-60 pounds each) Lot numbers
- 3. Crossbred Pen of 3 feeder pigs
- 4. Crossbred Sow, senior spring
- 5. Crossbred Sow, senior
- 6. Crossbred Junior yearling
- 7. Purebred Pen of 3 feeder pigs
- 8. Purebred Sow, senior spring
- 9. Purebred Sow, senior
- 10. Purebred Sow, junior yearling

 $\underline{Sow, senior spring}$  – born between Jan 1 and Feb 28/29 of exhibit year

<u>Sow, senior</u> – born between July 1 and Dec 31 of year preceding the exhibit year

<u>Sow, junior yearling</u> – born between Jan 1 – June 30 of the year preceding the exhibit year



## State paperwork requirements for all hogs coming to the fairgrounds:

- A paper copy of a **<u>negative test</u>** for the PRRS and PEVD virus per farm.
- A signed veterinary health certificate that states the "entire herd" was in good health at the time of inspection.
